Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice (Tenure Track)

- Commitment to both teaching and scholarship is essential;
- Preference will be given to candidates who have experience teaching and have an active research agenda. Candidates with research in any area of criminal justice will be considered;
- A deep appreciation for, and understanding of, working in an inclusive, engaging and diverse college;
- Culturally sensitive, caring and friendly with a deep understanding and appreciation of a multi-cultural college community and the Franciscan traditions of St. Francis College.
