

Position: Assistant Professor of Psychology (Tenure Track)

Job Summary: Candidates must be qualified by training and experience to teach both undergraduate and graduate level courses in the following areas: general psychology; psychology and disabilities; clinical and counseling psychology; and, experimental psychology. This appointment will also include College service/committee work, curricular development, research, student supervision, student advisement, research, and mentoring for undergraduate and graduate students. The normal teaching load per academic year is twelve credits in each Fall and Spring semester.

Qualifications:

- Ph.D. in Psychology or closely related discipline from an accredited institution at the time of application is required;
- Preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate experience and proficiency in conducting research and have prior experience teaching upper-division undergraduate courses;
- Commitment to teaching, scholarship and working with a diverse faculty and student body is essential;
- Candidates invited to interview will be asked to provide a statement of teaching/research interests and three letters of reference.

Please note that while we are commencing with recruitment efforts for this position, it is understood that hiring will be contingent on funding and enrollment.
