



Human resources (HR) legal consultants ensure companies are meeting legal and regulatory obligations when it comes to personnel. The role of an HR compliance manager is divided into two realms: policy development and enforcement. From a development standpoint, HR legal consultants bring their expert knowledge of human resources regulations to build out a company's HR policies on matters such as minimum wage, vacation, leaves, insurance, and labor conditions. On the enforcement side, HR legal administrators conduct audits, identify risks or issues, work to resolve challenges, and actively respond to disputes initiated by employees or former employees. Where required, human resources legal consultants will fill out and file compliance-related documentation and submit it to any regulatory agencies. HR legal consultants also advise upper management on potential risks and legal threats based on their operating standards. To become a human resources legal advisor, you'll need training and education in both human resources and employment law. A law degree may not be required for HR legal consultants, as this role often works with a company's internal or external lawyers.
